

Bluebonnet Animal Hospital is now offering the best in veterinary dental care, digital dental radiographs (x-rays).

The benefits of digital dental x-rays cannot be understated. While we can gain a great deal of information from gross examination of the teeth, one cannot truly know the health of a tooth without x-ray imaging that enables us to visualize the roots, ligaments that attach the roots to the underlying bone, surrounding bone, and the nerves.

Specifically, x-rays enable us to see what are known as resorptive lesions, which are areas of bone loss within a tooth root and/or its surrounding bone. These types of lesions are indications that an affected tooth has become more of a liability to a pet than a benefit. They are a common source of chronic infection, ongoing loss of bone, and pain and should be extracted.

A recent study has shown that 24% of dental lesions in dogs and 42% in cats are routinely missed when dental x-ray is not used to aid in assessing the health of teeth.

In cases where teeth necessitate extraction, post extraction x-rays are used to be certain the entire root of a given tooth have been removed. Retained root material remains a source of ongoing pain for the pet and can lead to abscess (pocket of infection) formation within the jaw bone.
