Purpose At the 19 & Under level, coaches should focus on the following age-appropriate concepts and skills so that players have a good experience and continue developing as hockey players and teenagers.

Focus Points : Fun and Engagement, Practice Activity and Structure, Age-Appropriate Training, Body Contact/Body Positioning,, Skill Development, Team Play, Training, Learning to Compete, Advancement past youth hockey

Teams: 19 & Under AA

Home Rink: Carlsbad (all practices)

Program: 24 weeks (72 on ice and 48 off ice practices)

Practices 3 On Ice & 2 Off Ice per week Start date: week of August 24th End date: week of March 1st

Black out dates: (no practices) * subject to change

Roster: 12 - 18 skaters, 1-2 goalies, equal playing time

Practice Focus: Practices should focus on (percentage of time listed after each)

- 1. Individual Skills (hockey skills and activities) 50%
- 2. Hockey Sense (teaching of concepts through small area games) 35%
- 3. Systems (team play training) 15%

Uniforms:

1. Game Jerseys/ Socks

All jerseys and merchandise are ordered on Uniform day which includes reservation of jersey number. Practice Jerseys and Red Helmet, gloves matching color scheme and black pants are required at this level.

* Practice Jersey numbers are predetermined.

Tryout Process:

- Pre register for tryouts at <u>www.wildcatshockey.com</u>
- Attend both days for proper team building and player placement
- Check in at front table, receive helmet sticker, place on child's helmet
- A list will be placed on Rink Glass with corresponding helmet sticker to signify what team your child has been placed on
- Proceed to the Signing Room to complete "Letter of Intent" (LOI) and financial agreement

Signing Process:

- On entrance to the signing room Wildcat staff will assist the parent in signing of the Letter of Intent and financial contract
- 1. Letter of Intent "LOI" On completion of the LOI the parent has reserved the player's spot on the team and is committed to the team for the season.
- 2. Financial Contract Wildcat staff will review all financial commitments for the season which entails two parts. (Club dues, Team fees, Team Uniforms)
